John 15:1-8

The Vine and the Branches

15 "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ² He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes^[a] so that it will be even more fruitful. ³ You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴ Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.

5 "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. 6 If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. 7 If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. 8 This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.

Message

Church Vitality

Rev. Jin Kook Kim

Good morning, Church Family! I hope you had a blessed week in Christ last week and God's love and grace had been full in your lives. I have shared with you the sermon series, "What the Bible Says about the Church" for the last six Sundays. The church is the people having faith in God, worshiping God together, caring for one another, welcoming all, sharing their faith with others, and working together as the body of Christ. These features of the church are the foundations of all churches in the world, and we also are on the same foundations. I hope we keep our features as a church community and develop ourselves in accordance with God's will and desire and under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. I would like to ask you to think of the church and pray for the church for three minutes every day because we need to gather our hearts for our church and its ministry, and we need everyone's prayers for the church and its ministry.

I had a blood test last week. It was the annual blood test. The health insurance company provides it every year encouraging people to have the test. I got the test result, and it showed

many numbers such as cholesterol, blood sugar, iron, protein, etc. The test result let me see whether each level is in the normal range or not and the numbers and ranges indicate what follow-up we should make. When we get hurt in our arm, hand, or leg, we have pain and the pain notice us that we should do something. Also, when we have a fever or chill, the feelings let us know to take rest or medication. However, we cannot see the level of each in the blood without a blood test. The numbers and levels of the blood test result are the markers that we need to monitor to prevent the worst case and keep our health.

When we see the people in ICU, we see they have monitors for their heartbeat, pulse, and oxygen level. Nurses and doctors monitor those numbers or graphs to care for them because those numbers or graphs are vital signs that show their vitality.

What would be the vital signs of the church? What do you think? What can be the vital signs of the church? The United Methodist Church, our denomination, and our Annual Conference, has encouraged us to monitor the five markers of the church's vitality. These are the five markers of church vitality.

First, worship attendance is a marker of church vitality. Worship is one of our foundations as a church family. As we considered in the sermon series, What the Bible says about the church, the church is the people having faith in God and worshiping God together for God's love and grace, salvation, and forgiveness. We are a worshiping community with our gratitude and commitment. Active and faithful Christians worship God and put their priority on Worship in their lives so the worship attendance shows the church's vitality.

Second, making new disciples is a marker of church vitality. Making new disciples mean receiving new members. As our mission statement indicates, we are here to make disciples of Jesus Christ. We are here to help people to accept Jesus as their Savior by sharing the Gospel with them such as who God is, What Jesus has done for us, and how the Holy Spirit leads us in our life journey. When Peter, one of Jesus' disciples, shared his faith and proclaimed the Gospel, people repented their sins and accepted Jesus as their savior, and formed the first church community in the Bible. The church grows and thrives when we have new members. Making new disciples shows our vitality as a church community.

Third, the small group is a marker of church vitality. It is hard for us to share our lives with others in a big group such as Sunday Worship. A small group is a good place where we share our lives with others. In a bible study group, a prayer group, a children's group, a youth group, a young adult group, or a circle of women or men, we can share our lives with others and learn from one another and encourage one another for our faith journey as companions. When we have more small groups, we can learn more, share our lives more, and have fellowship more.

Fourth, the mission is a marker of church vitality. God calls us to help others and share God's love and grace. The active church and growing church engage the local community and the world well. Through mission work, we help people in the world to experience God's love and grace. Through the hands-on mission, we can engage the people in our local community by seeing them, helping them, and connecting to them. The church should not be isolated but be in the community because God wants everyone in the world to come to God.

Lastly, giving is a marker of church vitality. Giving means our offerings and tithes. Our offerings and tithes are our hearts for God's ministry because we need resources to do our ministry. We

believe that every resource that we have is from God and God wants us to use it not only for us but also for God's ministry that helps people to experience God's love and grace and accept Jesus's love in their lives. Giving means not only giving our money but also our all resources, such as our spiritual gifts and talents, our knowledge, skill, and strength. When we give more, the church can do ministry more. When the church does ministry more, the church becomes active and thrives more.

These are the five markers of church vitality that the United Methodist Church encourages us to monitor for the church vitality. As you see, these five markers are basic ones. We will find other markers of the church's vitality if we want. However, these five markers can be our starting point to evaluate ourselves and to see where we should go or do.

These questions can help us to think of the church and ministry. How can we make our worship rich and beautiful more than now? How can we make our Sunday Worship engage the people in the local community and in the world? How can we invite people to our Sunday service? How can we make new disciples? How can we share the gospel and our faith with others in our daily lives? How can we have more small groups? What small group would people be interested in? What small group can help people to share their lives, encourage one another to go on the path of God, and pray for one another with hearts? What are the needs of our local community and the world? How can we engage the local community and the world more? How can we help people in the world? How can we give more? How can we encourage one another and new people to give their resources to God and God's ministry?

Little Falls Church family,

Jesus said, when we are in Jesus and Jesus is in us, we can bear fruits. We cannot bear any fruits when we leave Jesus. I pray for you, and I try to be in Jesus. That means we follow Jesus' teaching and life. That means we have the heart of Jesus. That means we consider what Jesus wants from us. Let us be in Jesus!

We cannot do the church ministry alone. We need all of you. We need all church members and friends to keep our church vitality and increase the church vitality. As we read the scripture this morning, two are better than one person because two can help one another and strengthen one another. Three would be better than one or two. Ten would be better than two or five. Fifty people would be better than thirty people. Little Falls Church family, it is much better that all of us work together than a few people work.

I would like to ask all of you to think of church vitality and share your idea with all of us and work together as one body, the body of Christ. When we gather our hearts and strength, when we work together in Christ, we will bear the fruits that God gives us. Amen.
