Gospel Lesson

Luke 16:19-31

The Rich Man and Lazarus

¹⁹ "There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and lived in luxury every day. ²⁰ At his gate was laid a beggar named Lazarus, covered with sores ²¹ and longing to eat what fell from the rich man's table. Even the dogs came and licked his sores.

²² "The time came when the beggar died and the angels carried him to Abraham's side. The rich man also died and was buried. ²³ In Hades, where he was in torment, he looked up and saw Abraham far away, with Lazarus by his side. ²⁴ So he called to him, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, because I am in agony in this fire.'

²⁵ "But Abraham replied, 'Son, remember that in your lifetime you received your good things, while Lazarus received bad things, but now he is comforted here and you are in agony. ²⁶ And besides all this, between us and you a great chasm has been set in place, so that those who want to go from here to you cannot, nor can anyone cross over from there to us.'

²⁷ "He answered, 'Then I beg you, father, send Lazarus to my family, ²⁸ for I have five brothers. Let him warn them, so that they will not also come to this place of torment.'

29 "Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the Prophets; let them listen to them.'

³⁰ "No, father Abraham,' he said, 'but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.' ³¹ "He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the Prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone rises from the dead."

Message Optional or Required?

Good morning, Church Family! I hope you had a blessed week in God's love and grace last week. God is good and God loves us and cares for us always. Last Sunday, we considered the message, "Helping the precious life." As children of God, we have God's compassion in our hearts, and we help others with compassion. Jesus' compassion led him to heal people and feed them although it was not planned. Likewise, our compassion has led us to help others. Helping the needy is serving Jesus as Jesus said that as we help the least, we do it to Jesus. Little Falls Church family, we inherited God's compassion. Whenever God gives us compassion in our heart when we see someone who needs our help, it is God's call and guidance to help them. Let us help others following God's compassion in our hearts.

I have a question. Is helping others optional or required? What do you think? Why do you think? We just help others only when we want if it is optional. If it is required, we should help others whenever someone needs our help. What do you think? Let us see what the Bible says about that?

In today's scripture, the Gospel lesson, there were a rich man and a poor man named Lazarus. The rich man was wealthy and had feasts every day. On the contrary, Lazarus was poor and sustained his life with the crumbles from the rich man's table. When both died, the rich man went to Hades (let us call it hell), and he suffered there. Lazarus went to the arms of Abraham (let us call it Heaven) and had peace. This is Jesus' parable and I want us to see two points from the parable. First, why was the rich man brought to hell and Lazarus Heaven? Was it because the rich man was rich and Lazarus poor as Abraham said, "Child, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things and Lazarus in like manner evil things, but now he is comforted here, and you are in agony." Does that mean that all rich people will suffer after death and all poor people peace? No. The point that Jesus wanted to make is that the rich man suffered in Hades because he didn't help the poor although he was wealthy enough to help the poor. He was wealthy as he was dressed with fine linen and feasted every day and Lazarus laid at the gate of the rich man's house. However he neglected the need of Lazarus and didn't give him food or open the door to let him take food from his table although he had more than enough. He should help the needy because it was God's will. Jesus was saying this parable to the Pharisees who were Jews and knew the Law of God well.

As we see in the Old Testament, God ordered the Israelites to help and care the least. According to God's words, they should care for orphans, widows, and strangers, foreigners. (Numbers 14:19, 29) They should not deal with the debtors as a creditor (Exodus 20:25) and they should give the cloak, which was as guarantee, to the debtor before the sun went down (Exodus 20:26). The cloak becomes the blanket that protects them from the cool air during night. God also said that if there is among you anyone in need, you should "not be hard-hearted or tight-fisted toward your needy neighbor. You should open your hand, willingly lending enough to meet the need, whatever it may be." (Deuteronomy 15:7-8). God wants people to help the needy and God always orders God's people to help the needy.

However, the rich man didn't help Lazarus who needed his help although the poor were at his door, and he was wealthy enough to help the poor. He neglected his responsibility on Lazarus. That was why he suffered after he died.

The second point of the parable is this: God cares for the needy. Lazarus went to the arms of Abraham. It was not because he was poor. The point here is God cares for the needy. Can you remember Jesus' sermon on the mount? "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the

kingdom of God. Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled. Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh." (Luke 6:20-21) Jesus wants to teach us that God cares for the needy in God's ways. God cares for them through God's people and through God's ways. If we don't help them, God will use another person or people and the needy will be in God's care through the helpers and the helpers become God's hands and feet who deliver God's care toward the needy. Both the needy and helpers are blessed but not the person who didn't help the needy.

Little Falls Church Family,

I believe that we are required to help others in our lives. People in the world who don't know God and God's will can say it is optional for them to help others. So, they help others when they want and don't help others when they don't want to help others. However, as God's children, we are required to help others because God wants us to help others and that is God's will for us. Church family, when God ordered the Israelites to help the needy, God said to them, "remember that you were aliens (Exodus 22:21)" that meant God cared for them when they were aliens, poor, and hungry so they were ought to help others as God cared for them. God was the ultimate one who gave them resources to live out their lives on earth and God wanted them to help others. Likewise, God wants us to help others. It is not optional but required because God has helped us first and because all resources that we have come from God. All are God's and we are stewards of them.

Church family, I hope and pray that we keep in our mind God's will for us that is given through Jesus' word today and help others and care for them. See the rich man. He asked Abraham to send him back to his brothers to teach them not to come to the place of torment. However, Abraham rejected his request, and said that they should listen to Moses and prophets who already gave them the same teaching that they should help others as following God's will. They would not listen from him if they didn't listen from the law of God. Church Family, God teaching is given to us already. Let us follow it and practice it rather than be a rich man who didn't follow God's will and be in the place of torment.

Church family, let us ask God to give us God's compassion and generosity in our hearts more and more so that let us help the needy by being God's hands and hearts. We help others not because we are super rich people, or we have too many things in our hands but because we have God's compassion and generosity and because we care for God's people as God cares for us and them. For us as children of God and disciples of Jesus Christ, helping others is required not optional because God helped us first and we are stewards of all resources that we have, and God is the owner of all even our lives. As faithful people of God, let us follow God's will by helping others and let us be in God's arms. Amen.
