#### THE PASTOR'S PEN

"But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have said to you." (John 14:26)

Little Falls Church family and friends,

I pray you and your family are doing well in God's love and grace and hope your faith journey goes well all the time.

Do you know what season is the longest in the Christian Calendar? It is the Pentecost season. The Pentecost Season is from Pentecost Sunday to the Sunday before the Advent Season. It's about 5 months. As we celebrated Pentecost Sunday, we are in the Pentecost Season now. We will go back to the Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter Seasons following the Christian Calendar to celebrate each season and remind us of the meanings of each season. However, we live now in the time of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus promised his disciples that God will send the Holy Spirit to disciples to lead them in their lives after Jesus ascended. Jesus' word became true. The Holy Spirit came upon them and worked in them and led them into God's ways. We can see the work of the Holy Spirit in the New Testament in the Book of Acts. As Jesus promised, the Holy Spirit taught them everything and reminded them of all that Jesus has said to them. They could keep going on their faith journey with the guidance and help of the Holy Spirit. Although they had lost their ways or fallen or failed in their faith journey, the Holy Spirit led them to get back to the faith journey.

Pentecost Sunday and the Pentecost Season

remind us that the Holy Spirit has come to us already and been with us now and will be with us forever. The same Holy Spirit who led the disciples and the congregation of the first church in the Bible is with us and teaches us everything and reminds us of all that Jesus said. What we should do is listen to the Holy Spirit carefully and follow the direction of the Holy Spirit.

What do you listen to from the Holy Spirit? What direction do you listen from the Holy Spirit for your life? What direction do we listen from the Holy Spirit for our church family and ministry? The Holy Spirit works in us and in our ministry. The Holy Spirit inspires all of us to worship and praise God, learn God's words, and follow God's will. The Holy Spirit leads us to help people in our local community and the world through our mission projects. We cannot count all works of the Holy Spirit. I believe that one of the works and directions of the Holy Spirit is "go and make disciples of Jesus Christ." It is the proclamation of Good News, the Gospel, God's love, and grace for all people in the world.

I hope we don't ignore or neglect the great commission that Jesus gave us. I pray all of us be witnesses of God's grace and Jesus' love for us and proclaim that to the people in our local community and in the world in ways. Let us try to find ways together, and work on the ways together. The Holy Spirit is with us. The Holy Spirit will lead us and help us for each step when we are willing to follow the Holy Spirit.
