OT Lesson Isaiah 61:1-4, 8-11

The Good News of Deliverance

61 The spirit of the Lord God is upon me because the Lord has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and release to the prisoners, ² to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn, ³ to provide for those who mourn in Zion—to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit. They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, to display his glory. ⁴ They shall

build up the ancient ruins; they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations.

⁸ For I, the LORD, love justice, I hate robbery and wrongdoing; I will faithfully give them their recompense, and I will make an everlasting covenant with them. ⁹ Their descendants shall be known among the nations and their offspring among the peoples; all who see them shall acknowledge that they are a people whom the LORD has blessed. ¹⁰ I will greatly rejoice in the LORD; my whole being shall exult in my God, for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation; he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with a garland and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. ¹¹ For as the earth brings forth its shoots and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up, so the Lord God will cause righteousness and praise to spring up before all the nations.

Gospel Lesson

Matthew 1:18-25

The Birth of Jesus the Messiah

18 Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be pregnant from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to divorce her quietly. ²⁰ But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." ²² All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: ²³ "Look, the virgin shall become pregnant and give birth to a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us." ²⁴ When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife ²⁵ but had no marital relations with her until she had given birth to a son, and he named him Jesus.

This is the word of God for the people of God.

Message A Time for Salvation Rev. Jin Kook Kim

Good morning, Church Family! I hope you had a blessed week in God's love and grace last week. We are in the Advent Season, and we are pondering the meaning of Christmas in this time of waiting for Christmas. Last Sunday we considered the purpose of Christmas. It is a time for celebration. Christmas is Jesus' birth and Jesus' coming into our lives. Jesus' birth is God's love and presence for us. God loves us so much and God is with us all the time. God's love and presence should be celebrated in our lives. Let us not miss a celebration for God's love and presence in this Christmas Season. One of the ways to celebrate Jesus' birth is to have a birthday party for Jesus, having a birthday cake, and singing a birthday song as we celebrate our loved one's birthday. Let us prepare a party for Jesus, remembering the meaning of Jesus' birth in our lives.

One of the joys of Christmas is giving and receiving gifts. We prepare gifts for them, thinking of our loved ones and what gifts would be the best for them. We think about how happy they will be when they receive our gifts while we are shopping the gifts for them. Giving gifts to our loved ones is a joy

for us. On the other hand, receiving gifts is another joy for us. We are happy when we receive our loved one's gift for us because we feel their love for us through the gift. We are grateful when we receive gifts because they are given to us freely. We don't work for it or pay for it. A gift is the giver's grace for us.

What Christmas gift do you remember the most? One of the gifts that I remember is a big box of a variety of snacks which I received when I was a little child. It was amazing. The box was wrapped as a gift with a ribbon. There were many kinds of snacks in the box. As a child, I was very happy about it because all kinds of snacks were in the box. What is your memory of a Christmas gift?

Do you know this? We receive the best gift on Christmas day because God gives us the best gift on Christmas day. It is Jesus and it is the best gift for us. The gift, Jesus, is like a box of snacks. Jesus gives us many things. Jesus' birth has a lot of meanings. As we considered last Sunday, Jesus' birth is God's giving out God's love and presence to us. Another meaning of Jesus' birth is Salvation.

In today's scripture reading, an angel came to Joseph who was engaged to Mary. At that time, he wanted to break off the engagement because he heard Mary was pregnant although they didn't live together yet. The angel told him that Mary had a baby in her womb by God's Spirit. And the angel also told him about the baby, "You are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

Through Jesus' birth, God gives us salvation. Through Christmas, God gives us the gift of Salvation through Jesus Christ. Christmas is a time for Salvation. Are you excited when you hear that God's gift for you is Salvation? Or not? Do you wish for other gifts from God rather than salvation? We are used to hearing the word Salvation. We are used to hearing that God saves us. So, we often devalue Salvation and the meaning of Salvation, or we neglect the real value of Salvation. Is Salvation a small gift? No, not at all. God's salvation for us is a huge gift.

What is salvation? Salvation means God saves us from our sins. No one is free from sin as we read in Romans 3:22, "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. We cannot handle our sins, and sin leads us to death as we read in James 1:15, sin gives birth to death. Salvation means we have new life in God, and we are promised eternal life in heaven. Jesus, the savior, is for you, each of us. Jesus is a personal savior which means Jesus saves you from your sins, not other people's sins. Jesus came to the world, to our lives to save us, each of us. The gift of salvation is a customized gift for you, each of us.

That's not all. Salvation is not only a future promise or future event but also a current event. When we think of spiritual salvation, we often think that salvation is being saved from hell. However, God's gift of true salvation is happening right now and continues. Since we accept Jesus as our savior, our lives are transformed and changed by God's spirit. Rather than put ourselves in the center of our lives, we put God, God's will, and desire in the center of our lives. That changes the direction of our lives and our life path to God's ways.

The author of the book, "The Purpose of Christmas" surveyed Christmas shoppers asking, "What do you need to be saved from?" People answered these: "From worry; from the cost of gas and my debt; from people who've hurt me; from my past – I can't seem to let it go; from my bad habits; from myself." How about you? What do you need to be saved from?

God's salvation is not only spiritual but also physical. Through Jesus, God's salvation for us, God makes us free from guilt over the past, bitterness and resentment, the expectations of others,

addictive habits, and the fear of death. When we fully believe in God's salvation for us, we have true freedom in our lives which gives us a new life, a new attitude, and a new perspective.

Like other gifts, God's gift of salvation is given to us freely. We call it God's grace. We don't pay for God's salvation, in fact, we cannot pay for it. We cannot earn it or get it by ourselves because only God can give us it. Although it is free, that doesn't mean that it is not valuable. It is priceless and valuable more than we think or imagine. God gives us a very big and huge gift on Christmas day. It is Salvation. Let us not devalue God's salvation for us. It is a gift more valuable than the gift of a house or a car. Let us not neglect the value of God's salvation. We cannot buy or earn it by ourselves, but we should have it. Christmas is exciting for us because God gives us God's great gift, Salvation, along with God's love for us and God's presence in our lives. This is why Christmas is special and should be celebrated in our lives. This is why Christmas is different from other holidays.

Church family, let us remind ourselves that we receive the best and greatest gift from God, and it is salvation on Christmas day. Like kids who are excited for Christmas for gifts, let us be excited for Christmas for God's great gift, Salvation, for us. Also, let us celebrate God's salvation for us in this Advent and Christmas Season. Christmas is a time for Salvation.

We are blessed because we are experiencing God's salvation in our lives through Christmas, Jesus' birth. We can participate in God's ministry to let people experience God's salvation too by helping them with our hands. Is there anyone near you who needs God's salvation? As God's hands and feet, we can do good work for them. Sending a warm note or a phone call to the person who is depressed or discouraged, visiting the lonely to be with them, helping with our hands those who need our help, giving a gift to others, participating in UMW's Toy Drive, donating blood, and many other ways can help people to experience God's salvation. Let us give them God's salvation by helping them with our hands because Christmas is a time for Salvation. Amen.
