God's People Are Comforted

40 Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. ² Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins. ³ A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. ⁴ Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. ⁵ Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken. ⁶ A voice says, "Cry out! "And I said, "What shall I cry? A Time for Celebration

Good morning, Church Family! I hope you had a blessed week in God's love and grace last week. Last Sunday was the first Sunday of Advent, and we considered Waiting for Christmas. Let us make this season the time to remember how precious Jesus' coming into our lives is. And let us remind ourselves that we are waiting for Jesus' second coming in this season. Whenever we are waiting, such as waiting in line to check out for shopping or in car traffic, let us remind ourselves that we are in Advent, the waiting time for Christmas, Jesus' coming. Then Our waiting time will be a great time to renew our gratitude for Jesus, the best gift for us.

The Advent and Christmas Season gives us a joyful and bright air. Christmas decorations, Carols, Christmas movies, Christmas gatherings, and the End of year parties help us celebrate the season. Are you planning to host or join a Christmas party, an End-of-year party, or a family gathering? What are you celebrating this Christmas? People celebrate this season for many reasons. The author of the book, The Purpose of Christmas, took a survey of Christmas shoppers with the question,

"What are you celebrating this Christmas?" Their responses are these: I'm celebrating that I made it through another year; I am celebrating being home with my family; I got a Christmas bonus; My son is home from deployment; The candidate I voted for got elected; I am celebrating that I've finished all my shopping; I'm not celebrating anything. I am just trying to survive.

What do you see from the responses? The responses are good reasons to celebrate but there is a missing one that is very important and the main purpose of Christmas. It is Jesus, Jesus' birth and Jesus' coming into the world. Christmas is Jesus' birth, Jesus coming into the world. For us, as Christians, the children of God and disciples of Jesus Christ, Christmas is the time to celebrate Jesus' birth. We celebrate Jesus' coming into our lives in this season.

Jesus' birth means God's love for us. As we read the scripture, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son." Jesus coming to us is God's love for us. God loves us so God gives us Jesus, God's only son, the precious son. God loves us so God gives us Godself because Jesus and God are one. We give Christmas gifts to family and friends because we love them and want to express our love for them. Not only Christmas but also other times, we give them something good, special, and important because we love them. We give ours to our family and friends because we love them. We can give ourselves when we love them that much. Parents give themselves to kids because they love them that much. Giving out our most precious things or ourselves is a great expression of our love for them. Christmas is God's giving out the most precious one, Jesus, to us. Christmas is God's giving out Godself to us. That is God's love for us. Church Family, Christmas is a time for celebration that God loves us so much. Let us celebrate Jesus' birth in the Christmas season. Let us celebrate God's love for us which is shown through giving us Jesus.

Church family, I hope we prepare a celebration for Jesus' birth for Christmas in the Advent season considering the meaning of Jesus' birth that God loves us so much and God is with us all the time. Jesus is all about Christmas. Rather than missing Jesus' birth on Christmas day or the Christmas season, let us celebrate Jesus' birth and its meanings on Christmas day.

The author of the book introduced his family tradition for Christmas in his book. When he was three, as a toddler he asked his mom, "Why do we have Christmas?" Mom said, "Christmas is the celebration of Jesus' birthday." In a burst of preschooler inspiration, he concluded with a child's logic, "Well then, we should have a birthday party! We can have cake and Koo-Aid and sing Happy Birthday to Jesus!" his mom said, "Okay, we will!" That was the first day of his family tradition for a birthday party for Jesus every Christmas.

A similar one happened in my house a few years ago. One day, just a thought came to me. 'Christmas is Jesus' birthday. When my family member has our birthday, we have a cake and sing the happy birthday song to celebrate the birthday. I want to celebrate Jesus' birth on Christmas day." So, I prepared a cake and a candle for Christmas the day before. On Christmas day, we got together at the table, had the cake, and sang the Happy Birthday song to Jesus.

Church family, are you planning for a family gathering or a friends gathering on Christmas day? I hope you plan a birthday party for Jesus at the gathering. Jesus is the birthday person. Let us celebrate Jesus' birth on Christmas day, Jesus' birthday. Will you or your family be alone at home and enjoy a peaceful day? Prepare a cake and a candle for Jesus' birthday and celebrate Christmas with a birthday party with Jesus. I also encourage you to remind yourself and your family that, on Christmas day, we celebrate Jesus' birth, which means God loves us and God is with us.

Also, I hope we don't lose joyful hearts for Christmas while we are preparing for Christmas. Let us rejoice in Christmas and the preparation for it while we shop for gifts, parties, food, etc. Christmas is a time for celebration of God's love and presence through Jesus' birth.
