As you know our finances are very limited at this time. I wish to acknowledge several individuals that have made extra contributions so that we were able to purchase necessary items. We just wanted to take this opportunity to update you on our current financial status. At this point in time we have received \$4500 grant from the conference which has helped our financial situation. Our yearly conference fees are \$62,421.36. To put our position in perspective, at this point we have \$42,597.28 in accessible cash. Last year at this time we had \$44,124.05 in accessible cash. It should be noted that we have only paid \$5701.50 in Shared Ministries so far this year. We are in arrears on Shared Ministries in the amount of \$11,403.00. We would be appreciative to all of you if you could prepay your pledges and/or give us something extra to help us meet our financial responsibilities. Any assistance would be appreciated.

We were then blessed with a matching monetary donation of \$1,100 from a member of our community!

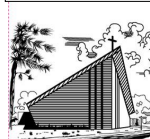

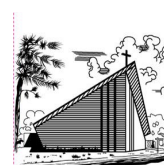
