Little Falls Church Family,

HOMELESS CARE PACKAGE

On September 25, I shared the idea of the homeless care package Outreach.

The first part, as members of LFUMC we carry a care package in our cars to give to the homeless we see on byways, storefronts with 'I'm homeless" signs.

The second part, the Kids for Christ Ministry is teaching our children charitable active work for our Lord.

The third part, the care package the children design and fill will be given to the souls for socks outreach, which goes into New York on Thursday nights to help the homeless in person.

November is the first month these care packages will be given. Our commitment is for 20 care packages the months of November, February, and May.

When needed, we will place a designated basket for donations in the Narthex on a table.

Water, juice boxes, fruit cups, pudding cups, Jell-O cups, tuna/pull tab, canned individual serve pre-cooked meats.
